INVISTA SITE RECEIVES HIGHEST LEVEL SAFETY AWARD

MONTERREY, Mexico (March 23, 2010) – INVISTA’s fiber facility in Monterrey received the Safe Company Recognition from La Secretaria del Trabajo y Previsión Social (STPS). The recognition, awarded March 10, placed INVISTA in the "Re-validation Level 3 - Effective Management" category, the highest level issued by the Mexican Labor Authority.
